I SHALL NOT BE SILENT**

In 1930's Berlin, Joachim Prinz witnessed how the Nazis stripped away the civil rights of Jews. When he arrived in the U.S. in 1937 and witnessed racism against African-Americans, he was inspired to act. Prinz became a leader of the civil rights movement and spoke at the 1963 March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom, where he declared: "bigotry and hatred are not the most urgent problem. The most urgent, the most disgraceful, the most shameful and the most tragic problem is silence." Moments later, Martin Luther King, Jr. delivered his famous "I Have a Dream" speech.
