**APPROVED LIST
OF INTERNATIONAL AND OFF-CAMPUS PROGRAMS**

Recognizing that Drew University's array of International and Off-Campus Programs may not meet the interests and academic needs of all its students, the University has developed an approved list of international and off-campus programs. This list contains programs of study that have been approved by the faculty for transfer credit for your Drew degree. The programs on the approved list have been selected on the basis of their academic and administrative quality and of their ability to serve the academic needs and interests of Drew students.

Approved List participants must carry a minimum GPA of 3.0 or the minimum required by the program they are applying to, whichever is higher. Students must also maintain good academic and disciplinary standing through their scheduled dates of participation. It should also be noted that the number of transfer credits allowed towards graduation is limited to 50% of the total required, or 64 credits. Students who wish to participate in Approved List programs during the sophomore year may petition the Faculty Advisory Committee on International and Off-Campus Programs (FACIOP). Students who wish to participate in Approved List Programs during the second semester of their senior year may petition the Committee on Academic Standing. Students should check with the Registrar and their advisors to be sure that off-campus study will not cause them to fall below the 64 credits they are required to take at Drew.

As a matter of policy, students are expected to transfer a minimum of 15-16 semester hours of credit back to Drew per semester of study abroad. All courses must be pre-approved as part of the application process. Once abroad, students who wish to withdraw from or change courses must submit requests to the IOCP Office. These requests will then be reviewed by FACIOP, who will act as the students' academic advisors while the student is abroad. FACIOP will either approve the request, ask the student to find another course, or deny the request. It will be the responsibility of the student to ensure that course adds and drops are approved via the CLA Pre-Approval Form or through FACIOP to ensure the receipt of credit.

Students may study abroad in programs not on the approved list; however, students should be advised that none of their Drew University financial aid will be transferable to non-approved programs. Students who wish to study on non-approved programs must complete a special study abroad leave form. In addition, students must meet with the IOCP Director to plan their program and have their advisors/department chairs complete the course approval form in order to transfer credit back to Drew.

Please note that students are now permitted to attend approved-list programs in countries on the State Department Travel Warning List. Students interested in studying in these countries must meet with the IOCP Director, review appropriate safety policies and procedures, sign a special waiver form, and receive written permission from the IOCP Director to receive clearance to enroll programs operating under a travel warning.

Ghana: CIEE (F/Sp/Y). In Legon. Arts & Sciences program. Taught in English and Twi. African Studies, Community Health, English Lit, Music, Philosophy, Theater, Twi. Apply by April 1/November 1. (*Offered only when Drew's Semester in Africa is not available.*)

Kenya: *For the 2009-2010 academic year, due to Kenya's placement on the State Department Travel Warning List, students must meet with the IOCP Director and receive written approval to study in Kenya.*

School for Field Studies (F/Sp). Wildlife Management Studies. Kilimanjaro Bush Camp in Kimana. Taught in English. Requires one semester in Biology or Ecology. Rolling Admissions.

Senegal: CIEE (F/Sp/Y). In Dakar. Language in Culture. Courses in French and English. French, Wolof, Development, Cultural Studies, Humanities. Internship/Volunteer options. Apply by March 15/October 15.

South Africa: Arcadia (F/Sp/Y). In Cape Town. Arts & Sciences program. Taught in English. Full Curriculum. Apply by March 15/October 15.

ASIA:

China: Joule (University of Nanjing) (F/S). In Nanjing. Chinese language, arts, culture, social sciences and politics. Courses (other than language) taught in English. Apply by Fall deadline TBA/November 1.

India: CIEE (F/Sp/Y). In Hyderabad. Arts & Sciences program at Hyderabad University. Full Curriculum. Apply by April 1/November 1.

South Korea: CIEE (F/Sp/Y). In Seoul. Full Curriculum through Yonsei University. Apply by April 1/November 1.

Thailand: Pro World (F/Sp). Bangkok at Mahidol University. Southeast Asian Studies, Poverty & Rural Development, Sustainable Development, Global Resources. Community Development Project. Apply by April 30/October 15 (early application).

EUROPE:

Austria: SUNY University at Binghamton (F/Y). In Graz. Full curriculum, German language. Taught in German. Direct enrollment at Karl-Franzens-University available. Requires 2 years college German. Apply by March 15.

England: University of Manchester (F/Sp/Y). In Manchester. Full curriculum. Apply by May 31/Oct 15.

France: IES Abroad (F/Sp/Y). In Nantes Taught in French. Direct enrollment, Teaching internships available. Art History, History, French language and literature, International Business, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, Theater. Require 2 years French. Apply by May 1/Nov. 2.

CIEE (F/Sp/Y). In Paris. Contemporary French Studies. French language, French art, French history, French literature, French politics. Taught in English and/or French. Requires 3.0 GPA and 1 year of French. Apply by April 1/November 1.

University of Minnesota. (F/Sp/Y). In Montpellier. Direct enrollment at University of Montpellier. French language, culture, history, literature, humanities, social sciences, sciences and business. Apply by Apr 1/ Oct 1.

Germany: European College of Liberal Arts (Y). In Berlin. Art History, Philosophy, Literature, Cultural Studies, History, Political Science. Taught in English. German, French, Spanish courses available. Apply by April 30 (Feb. 16 preferred).

Ripon College (F/Sp/Y). In Bonn. Full curriculum. Taught in German. Direct enrollment at the University of Bonn. Three semesters of college German required. Apply by April 6/November 7.

University of Wisconsin-Madison (Y). In Freiburg. Full curriculum. Taught in German. Direct enrollment at Albert Ludwig University available. Requires 4 semesters German. Apply by Feb. 13.

Greece: Arcadia University (F/Sp/Y). In Athens. Archaeology, Art, History, Business, Classics Greek Language and Literature, History, International Relations, Philosophy, Political Science, Religion and Sustainable Development. Taught in English but must take Modern Greek. Apply by April 20/October 1. (Fellowship recipients only)

College Year in Athens (F/Sp/Y). In Athens. Archaeology, Art History, Classics, Ethnography, Greek language and literature, History, International Relations, Philosophy, Political Science, Religion. Taught in English. Apply by May 1/ October 15. (Fellowship recipients only)

Ireland: National University of Ireland, Galway (F/Sp/Y). In Galway. Direct enrollment. Full Curriculum. Apply by Apr 30/Oct 31.

Italy: Studio Art Centers International (F/Sp/Y). In Florence. Art conservation, Art history, Ceramics, Drawing, Batik, Graphics Design, Italian language, Jewelry, Digital Multimedia, Museology, Painting, Photography, Sculpture, Animation. Taught in English. Internships. Apply by May 1/October 15.

Temple University (F/Sp). In Rome. Liberal Arts Program Only. Art History, Italian language, Social Sciences and Humanities. Taught in English. Apply by April 1/October 1.

Russia: AIFS (F/Sp/Y). In St. Petersburg. Direct Enrollment at St. Petersburg State Polytechnic University. Art History, History, Literature, Political Science, Religion, Sociology, Russian language. Taught in English and Russian. No Russian language requirements. Apply by May 15/Oct 1.

Scotland: University of Edinburgh (F/Sp/Y). In Edinburgh. Direct enrollment. Full Curriculum. Humanities/Social Sciences full year only. Science/Engineering full year or semester.

Spain: Center for Cross-Cultural Studies (F/Sp/Y). In Seville. Spanish language and literature, Business, Culture, History and Civilization. Taught in Spanish. Requires one semester of advanced Spanish. Apply by May 15/Nov 1.

LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN:

Argentina: IES Abroad (F/Sp/Y). In Buenos Aires. The Arts, International Business, Social Sciences, Spanish Language and Literature. Taught in English and Spanish. Direct enrollment and internships/service learning available. Apply by Mar 13/Nov 2.

Belize: Pro World. (F/Sp).Based in San Ignacio. Sustainable Development, Social Issues in a Developing Country. Other coursework at Galen University. Development projects. Apply by Apr 30/Oct 15 (early application).

Chile: IES Abroad (F/Sp/Y). In Santiago. Archaeology/Anthropology, Art History, Economics, Environmental Studies, History, International Relations Literature, Political Science, Sociology. Taught in Spanish. Direct enrollment and internships/service learning available. Requires 2 years of Spanish. Apply by April 1/November 2.

Costa Rica: University of Kansas (F/Sp). In San Jose. Full Curriculum. Direct enrollment. Taught in Spanish. Requires proficiency in Spanish. Apply by Mar 1/Oct 1.

Ecuador: IES Abroad (F/Sp/Y). In Quito. Taught in Spanish. Anthropology/Sociology, Environmental Studies, Political Economics, Spanish. Direct enrollment and internships/service learning available. Requires 2 years of Spanish. Apply by Apr 1/Nov 2.

Mexico: Pro World. (F/Sp). Based in Oaxaca. Spanish Language, Conflict & Change, Health & Society, Mesoamerican Archaeology. Development Projects. Apply by Apr 30/Oct 15 (early application).

Peru: Pro World. (F/Sp). Based in Cusco. Art & History in Peru, Development Work, Latin American Politics, Intensive Spanish. Development Projects. Apply by Apr 30/Oct 15 (early application).

Turks & Caicos School for Field Studies (F/Sp). In South Caicos. Marine Resource Mgmt Studies. Taught in English. Requires one semester in ecology or biology. Rolling admissions.

MIDDLE EAST:

Egypt: American University in Cairo (F/Sp/Y). In Cairo. Full Curriculum, Middle East Studies. Apply Feb 1/Aug 1.

Israel: *For the 2009-2010 academic year, due to Israel's placement on the State Department Travel Warning List, students must meet with the IOCP Director and receive written approval to study in Israel.*

Hebrew University (F/Sp/Y). In Jerusalem. Full curriculum, languages, Middle East Studies. Taught in English. Direct enrollment. Apply by April 5/November 6.

University of Haifa. Full curriculum, Hebrew language, Middle East Studies. Taught in English. Apr 15/Nov 15.

Tel Aviv University (F/Sp/Y). In Tel Aviv. Full curriculum, Hebrew language, Middle East Studies. Taught in English. Direct enrollment. Apply by May 1/November 1.
